# DUO Security

## Problem with registering for Duo with international numbers

Are you unable to register a mobile device with a international number for Duo because you did not receive the initial text?

If you will have the international number for an indefinite period, please register the international mobile phone as a landline device (as opposed to mobile). When registering, input the phone number starting with the country code. You **MUST** add + before the country code (e.g., +30 for Greece, +44 for United Kingdom). With this method, you will get a phone call asking you to authenticate rather than the text with the link.

Similarly, you can register your smartphone as a tablet device to use push notifications over the internet, or the 6-digit code generated by the Duo Mobile App which requires no internet access.

# Princeton Wireless Network

## Connecting to eduroam on Mobile

### Manual configuration steps

**This information is provided if you experience difficulty using the CAT Tool. Please note that the following steps or order might be different depending on your version of Android OS.**

- 1. On your Android device, go to Settings, then tap Wireless & networks, then Wi-Fi settings.**
- 2. Tap eduroam.**
- 3. Make sure that for EAP method, PEAP is selected.**
- 4. Tap Phase 2 authentication, and then select MSCHAPV2.**
- 5. For CA certificate, select "Use System Certificate."**
- 6. Username/Identity: Your NetID@princeton.edu**
- 7. Password: Your NetID password.**
- 8. Some devices may have an "Anonymous identity" field. Leave this blank.**
- 9. If asked for a Domain, enter princeton.edu (not all Android devices require a domain).**
- 10. Tap Connect.**
- 11. If asked to accept the cppm-04.princeton.edu certificate click yes.**
